#### Notice of intended completion of building work

With a number of recent construction problem-cases such as Opal Towers the NSW Dept of Fair Trading is requiring that developers with building work approaching completion must give notice of when they will apply for an Occupation Certificate. Notice is to be given at least six months before the application for an occupation certificate is made.

Fair Trading stated that 'Giving notice of an application for an occupation certificate allows time for a review of the building development including a possible Occupation Certificate Audit to identify any serious defects before the building is completed and buyers settle their contracts.'

#### **Covid changes for investigations officers**

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, a number of Acts were amended to enable authorised officers and investigation officers to take evidence and answers to questions by audio link or audio visual link.

On 20 November 2020, new clauses were inserted into the regulations to extend the provisions to 26 March 2021. The new clauses permit investigation officers and authorised officers to authorise a person to answer questions using audio link or audio visual link of a kind approved by the officer, rather than attend at a specified place and time. value and contribution will assist in making decisions about current and future agricultural land uses. <a href="https://www.lindsaytaylorlawyers.com.au/in">https://www.lindsaytaylorlawyers.com.au/in</a> focus/covid-19-investigations-via-avl/


